## What are Local Labour Market Partnerships?

Local Labour Market Partnerships (LLMP) support community partners in identifying economic trends and creating strategies to develop a responsive local labour force. Community partnerships are formed to identify and initiate projects. Activities must address a community labour market need.

## Types of Activities

Some examples of eligible activities include:

- ▶ Developing a strategic plan to address community economic and employment issues;
- ▶ Developing local planning groups;
- ▶ Researching and marketing new programs and services;
- ▶ Analyzing training and employment opportunities;
- ▶ Tracking or assessing labour market or community interventions; and/or
- ▶ Promoting employment supports to employers and unemployed individuals.

## Who are Eligible Sponsors?

To be eligible for Local Labour Market Partnerships, a community partnership must be formed with the goal of developing increased employment and economic success through common initiatives.

Partners may be formed among the following community representatives:

- ▶ For profit business;
- ▶ Non-profit organizations;
- ▶ Governments (regional, municipal, territorial, federal);
- ▶ Aboriginal organizations;
- ▶ Public health and education providers;
- ▶ Boards and agencies;
- ▶ Employee/employer associations; and/or
- ▶ Community and special interest groups.

Sponsors must have a minimum of 3 different partners representing diverse community components. Each community partner is expected to assume an active role and make a significant contribution to the proposed cooperative effort, either financial or in-kind.

## Financial Assistance

Sponsors may be eligible for:

- ▶ Wages;
- ▶ Administration costs;
- ▶ Professional service fees;
- ▶ Disbursements for research or technical studies;
- ▶ Commuting; and/or
- ▶ Capital costs.
